



## The story of the wine ...

## 2012 Le Droit

Winemaking Description: Made from low yielding fruit from the Lethbridge vineyard. Each variety is processed and matured separately in 70% new French oak for 18 months. The wine is blended prior to bottling to produce a balanced style that will improve for many years.

Tasting Notes: A nose of bramble and blackberry with savoury undertones leads to a full palate of blackberry and earth, with hints of leaf. There is underlying length from supple tannins and acid intermingling with the fruit.

Review: "Blackcurrant, blackberry, black olive and truffle, mint, and a fair serve of coffee oak. Medium bodied, all truffle and black olive with blackberry pastille sweetness to the fruit. Has a pleasing density to it without being heavy, black coffee flavour too, slightly sour tomato acidity, and grainy tannin firming up the finish. Certainly has character. Kind of hard to rate: it's one of those wines that will find admirers, for sure." 91 points, Gary Walsh, The Wine Front
