

The story of the wine ...

2015 Great Western Shiraz

Winemaking Description: This is our second offering of a Shiraz from Great Western by Lethbridge. The region has a well deserved reputation for ripe, dense fruit, that avoids being overblown or jammy and our aim was to create a quintessentially Australian wine with a level of "old world" savouriness. The wine is made in a natural and gentle way, wild yeast fermentation, large old oak maturation and low levels of sulphur dioxide.

Tasting Notes: Perhaps the key to this wine is the purity of fruit. My view is that the joyful expression of fruit with little extraneous artifacts is its defining thread. This wine is effortlessly delicious.
